#### **DANGER**

### **Precautionary Statements - Prevention**

Use explosion-proof electrical equipment and use only non-sparking tools.

Wash face, hands, and any exposed skin thoroughly after handling. Do not eat, drink, or smoke when using this product.

Use only outdoors or in a well-ventilated area. Avoid breathing fume, mist, vapors, or spray

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Wear protective gloves, protective clothing, and eye protection or face protection.

#### **Precautionary Statements - Response**

### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Ingestion: Rinse mouth. Do NOT induce vomiting. Call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician immediately.

**Skin contact:** Wash with plenty of water. Take off contaminated clothing and wash before reuse. If skin irritation occurs, get

medical advice/attention.

Inhalation: If difficulties occur after mist/vapors/spray has been inhaled, remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable

for breathing. Call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician if you feel unwell.

Eye contact: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue

rinsing. Get medical advice/attention immediately.

#### Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed.

Contact with eyes may cause serious damage or irritation leading to discomfort, redness, swelling or blindness. Contact with skin may cause irritation with local redness and possible dermatitis shortly after exposure. Inhalation of vapors may cause drowsiness or dizziness, headaches, fatigue, muscular weakness and in extreme cases, loss of consciousness. Ingestion may cause gastrointestinal irritation, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Ingestion may cause pneumonitis or pulmonary edema if aspirated.

Contain and solidify with inert absorbent materials. Keep in suitable, closed containers for disposal. Following product recovery, flush area with water. For large spills, stop flow of material, prevent product from entering drains, and pump off product where this is without risk and possible. Proceed as above.
