Flammable liquid and vapor

Precautionary Statements - Prevention

Keep away from heat, hot surfaces, sparks, open flames and other ignition sources. No smoking.
Keep container tightly closed.
Ground/bond container and receiving equipment. Use explosion-proof electrical, ventilating, lighting, and mixing equipment.
Use only non-sparking tools. Take action to prevent static discharges.
Wear protective gloves/protective clothing/eye protection/face protection.

Precautionary Statements - Response

IF ON SKIN (or hair): Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. Rinse skin with water (or shower).
IF INHALED: If difficulties occur after mist/vapors/spray has been inhaled, remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. Call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician if you feel unwell.
IF SWALLOWED: Do NOT induce vomiting. Immediately call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician.
In case of fire: Use CO₂, foam, dry chemical, water fog to extinguish.

Precautionary Statements - Storage

Store locked up. Store in a well ventilated place. Keep cool.

Precautionary Statements - Disposal

Dispose of contents/container to an approved waste disposal plant according to local, provincial/federal regulations.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye contact	Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Call a physician if irritation persists.

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Contact with eyes may cause irritation or discomfort. Inhalation of mist/vapors/spray may cause respiratory tract irritation leading to a temporary burning sensation of the nose and throat, coughing, and difficulty breathing. Ingestion may cause irritation or a burning sensation of the mouth and throat and abdominal pain. May cause pneumonitis if aspirated.

Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Treat symptomatically.

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES**Suitable Extinguishing Media**

CO₂, foam, dry chemical, water fog.

Unsuitable Extinguishing Media

Do not use a solid water stream as this may spread the fire.

Specific hazards arising from the chemical

During fire, gases hazardous to health may be formed including oxides of carbon, smoke and other irritating gases.

Protective Equipment and Precautions for Firefighters

As in any fire, wear self-contained breathing apparatus pressure-demand, MSHA/NIOSH (approved or equivalent) and full protective gear.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Remove all sources of ignition. Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Use personal protective equipment.

Environmental Precautions

Avoid discharge into drains/surface waters/groundwater.

Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Contain and solidify with inert absorbent material. Keep in suitable, closed containers for disposal.

Precautions for Safe Handling

Handling Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Ensure thorough ventilation of work areas.

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Storage Keep containers tightly closed away from direct sunlight in a dry, cool and well-ventilated place, away from incompatible materials.
